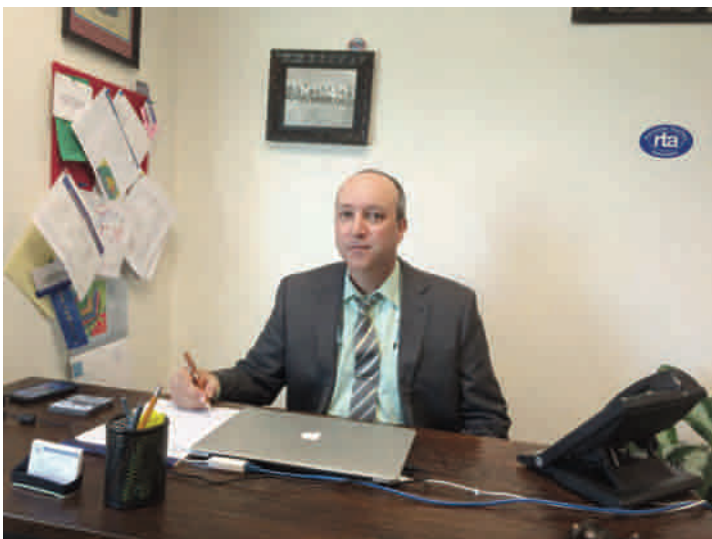

## HELP IN REGISTERING YOUR TEACHER CERTIFICATION FROM DAVE WURZ AT THE RTA OFFICE



Continuing Teacher and Leader Education is a law adopted into practice by the Board of Regents. The new law states " **that all holders of a permanent or professional certificate are subject to registration of their certificates starting July 1<sup>st</sup> 2016 if one is an active teacher or wishes to**

**return to teaching in any capacity."** If one never wishes to return to teaching in N.Y.S. one may "register as "inactive" thus not being subject to CTLE requirements and still keeping one's certificates in good standing."

Now, to cut thru the legalese for retired teachers: **If you think you are going to teach again in New York State or are currently teaching, you must register at the link below. If you are "undecided" you must still register at the link below but only have to check "inactive".**

When one goes to the website below, you are taken to the New York State Government website and one must register with this website just to be able to click on the special "teacher registration" tab that takes one to yet another website to register one's teaching certificates. The process is as follows: Type in <http://www.highered.nysed.gov/tcert/teach/home.html> and press return.

- Click "Create a NY.gov TEACH account"
- Check the box "I have not created a TEACH account..."
- Click "Create Account"
- Fill in requested information
- Click "Teach Online Services"
- Click "View Registration Status"
- Follow the prompts...

However, I have found this process difficult to navigate at times and would be glad to take any "walk ins" M, T, TH, and F and register one using my computer in my office. ### June 2, 2016

1. Meeting was called to order at 10:08.

2. A moment of silence was observed for teachers who have passed away the past month: Arlene Kantor, Bob Fuller.

3. United Way — Al Smith said that he was concerned that not all retired teachers are receiving the United Way forms and that designation forms for specific groups are not included. If you would like the forms you can contact Rodney Young at United Way who is the RCSD liaison for the forms. Charlie Dean said that he would check to see if it is legal to put the information on the RTA website.

4. Teacher registration for retirees subbing or to maintain your certification must be done between July 1, 2016 and June 30, 2017 during your birthday month. If you do not do this and want to renew your certification at a later date there may be a penalty fee. Registration is good for a 5 year period. Register at [www.highered.nysed.gov/tcert](http://www.highered.nysed.gov/tcert).

5. Books for Kids — The group has finished for the year. September 8 is the annual organizational meeting. Donations are accepted year round to Books for Kids/FLACE. All donations are tax deductible.

6. Vote-Cope — Dave Altobelli reported that after his discussion at Executive Council to bring more members to Vote Cope or to get Council members to increase their contribution only 2 of the Council increased their contributions and there continues to be Council members who are not Vote Cope contributors. There has been a request to explain how local Vote Cope money is spent. John Pavone has been asked to come in to the next RRTA meeting to report on this. Dave said that the current Vote Cope campaign is not showing the results he had hoped for when the information had been sent out.

7. Retirement Dinner — Mary Barnun said that there is a packet she prepares to share at the RTA retirement dinner, June 7. It will include the Vote Cope pension deduction form as well as a list of activities that RRTA participates in and the advantages for becoming an RRTA member.

8. Baseball Game — Charlie Dean is turning in the information at Frontier Field to pick up the June 10 tickets on June 2 and will be sending out the information to those attending the game and to those choosing the picnic. He has 40 RRTA people who will attend the game.

9. Dress a Girl — Gaya Shakes said the Lifetime Assistance came and shared information about the 50 dresses sent to Zululand. They showed products they brought back. Also 40 dresses went to the HUG organization for children with clef repairs.

10. Shaw — June 7 the group is set to go to A Woman of No Importance. June 16 is full for Alice in Wonderland. She is still hoping to get enough for the September 16 trip to Sweeney Todd. July 18 is the deadline for that trip.

11. Membership — There are 711 members for the 2015 - 16 year, which is the highest number RRTA has had.

12. Mary Barnum discussed articles and pictures for the August newspaper. Send in anything you want to share to her by July 14.

13. Nominations of RRTA reps — At the last meeting the 18 expiring term members were nominated. No new nominations were received before the deadline. The 18 nominated were accepted and no election needs to be held.

14. Hurd Orchards Luncheon — Linda Rapkin has chosen the August 18 luncheon. She has reserved 20 places, but may ask for more if she receives more people responding. There is a June 30 deadline because Hurds wants their money 45 days prior to the luncheon. A separate mailing went out to all RRTA members on June 2. Members price is \$29.00 and non members is the full price \$38.61.

15. Labor Council — Freddie Macek reported that the Rochester Labor Council collected \$14,000 and gallons of water to send to Flint, Michigan. RRTA donated almost \$200.

COPE picnic is June 23 at Genesee Valley Park at 5:30 in the Round House Pavillion.

There is a \$15/\$10 (seniors) cost to meet local politicians.

Labor Day Parade is on Labor Day this year.

Verizon has a tentative agreement.

16. Mount Hope Cemetery — Don't forget the June 28 tour. More people need to be signed up for it to go.

17. RRTA Picnic — It is at Canandaigua Yacht Club on June 24. Call Sue Raymond for a count and there is a \$6 cost for meat and corn or a dish to pass.

18. Kevin Fager spoke about an article in the morning D&C about the Governor signing the bill for veterans to buy back 3 years for their pension.

19. Al Smith said that 5 teachers are being recognized for Teacher of the Year receiving \$250 each from the Air Force.

He is involved with Beep Baseball before the Monday, June 6 baseball game at Frontier Field. Money is raised to help the blind.

Toastmasters has a grant to train special ed students to prepare them to give speeches. Contact Al Smith for information or suggestions of students to choose.

20. Lillian Bonanni shared information about the Mercury Opera at Glimmerglass in Cooperstown. July 25 there is a 1:30 matinee and there is a bus leaving Rochester at 7:30 am. If you would like more information, contact Lillian Bonanni.

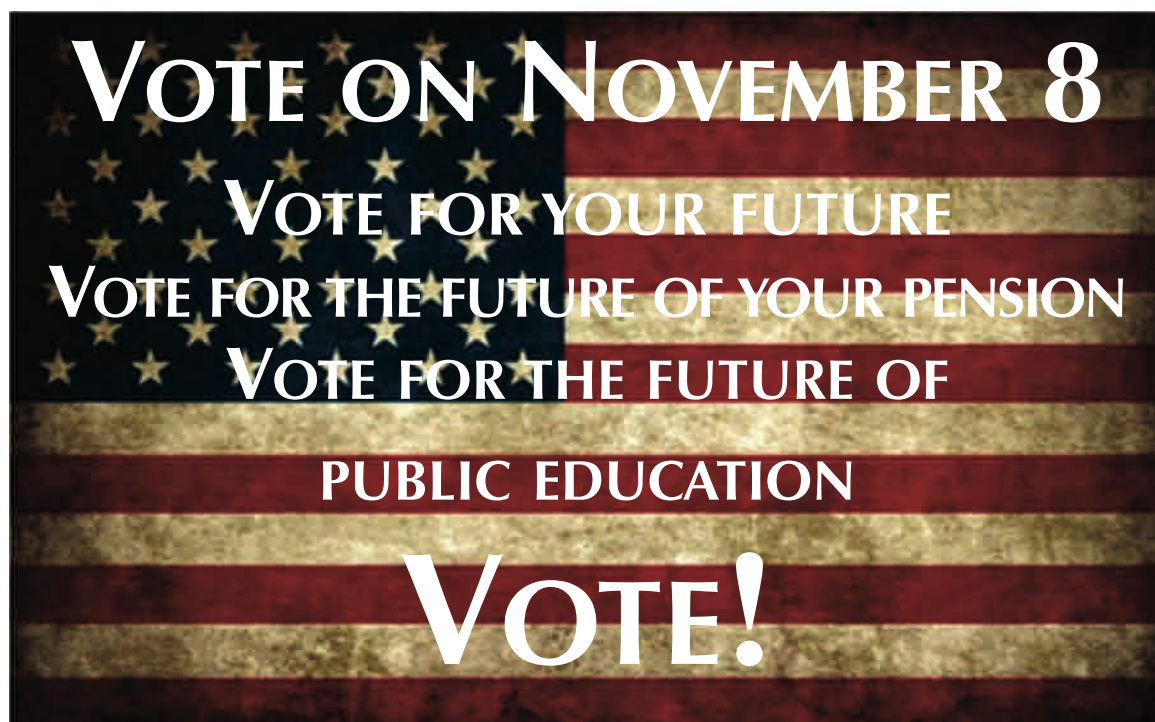
